Al and E first made the quilt when their friend Colin had top surgery.



Top surgery is an **operation** that some **trans people** might have on their **chest**.



Some **trans people** also choose to take **hormones**. Hormones are usually **made in your body**, but some trans people might **choose** to have **different hormones** to the one their body makes.



When **AI** started taking **hormones**, **Colin** and their friend **Joe** added more things to the quilt and gave it back to AI.

Other parts make references to **queer history**, like the **lavender** and the **pansy**.




A few parts are **very serious**. This patch says **you are trans enough**.




The quilt has **new things** added to it all the time.
